QUARTER ONE:

Coastal Range Food Bank, Inc. (CRFB)

Each month the Coastal Range Food Bank (CRFB) provides emergency food to Benton County individuals. Customers shop in their country store for quality items that include meat/fish, produce, canned and dry foods, and bottled drinking water. CRFB features a total Organic section with items purchased from First Alternative Co-op. They create access to varieties of healthy food by promoting client autonomy, reducing barriers to food access.

Community Outreach, Inc.

Community Outreach Inc. provides essential social services to youth and adults in the mid-Willamette Valley. They believe that everyone, regardless of their personal circumstances deserves to be treated with dignity and respect and offered the skills, knowledge, and assistance needed to help themselves lead healthy and productive lives.

Philomath Community Gleaners

Philomath Community Gleaners is a non-profit community membership organization in which members work side by side to provide a “helping hand” not a “handout”. Members glean food, household supplies, and wood. Regular members share food with adoptees (those who are elderly or disabled and not required to work). Many tons of food are kept out of the landfill by the work of Philomath Community Gleaners.

Vina Moses

Helps people through hardship, engaging the community to build resilience and improve well-being. Vina Moses serves low-income and under-resourced communities in Benton County. Their programs include a free thrift store, back to school and giving tree programs, outdoor food & hygiene pantries, and emergency financial assistance.

QUARTER TWO:

CASA - Voices for Children

CASA’s mission is to ensure the best outcome and future for each abused and neglected child in Benton County and beyond by training volunteers to provide advocacy and life skills, while expanding services to help kids thrive.

Center Against Rape and Domestic Violence (CARDV)

The mission of the CARDV is two-fold: To provide services and support to those affected by sexual and domestic violence, and to provide education and leadership within the community to change the societal conditions that cultivate these forms of violence.

Jackson Street Youth Services

Jackson Street Youth Services is here to promote safety, stability and well-being for youth. They work to prevent homelessness by showing a path to long-term success through building positive relationships and teaching skills for self-sufficiency. Their 24/7 shelters provide crisis stabilization for youth who are experiencing or at-risk-of homelessness. Beyond the shelter doors, prevention and outreach programs aim to halt youth homelessness before it begins.

South Corvallis Food Bank

South Corvallis Food Bank seeks to increase sustainable food security in south Corvallis by providing emergency food boxes, information, and opportunities with compassion and respect. With food prices increasing, there's been a rapid growth in demand for food in 2022. South Corvallis Food Bank is currently providing food boxes to approximately 1,500 households each month.

QUARTER THREE:

Casa Latinos Unidos

Casa Latinos Unidos serves and strengthens the Latinx communities of Benton and Linn Counties. It provides direct assistance and wraparound services to individuals and families who have difficulty navigating the system of services because of linguistic and cultural barriers. As part of this, the organization has an emergency assistance program to help people in need with rent and food. Additionally, Casa Latinos Unidos implements leadership and culturally appropriate educational programs, and celebrates the culture of the local Latinx population.

Old Mill Center for Children and Families

Old Mill Center is a community-based, family-oriented center empowering children and families of diverse backgrounds to optimize their potential through specially designed education and therapy programs. Old Mill Center now offers six programs that respond to the community's changing needs. They support the social, emotional, physical, and mental health needs of children and families, providing critical support to those who need it most.

Senior Dog Rescue of Oregon

Senior Dog Rescue promotes the well-being, safety, and care of older dogs. Our mission is finding new homes for dogs who are homeless or in unhealthy or unsustainable homes, so that they may spend the remainder of their lives in positive, loving homes.

Unity Shelter

Unity Shelter's mission is to provide safe shelter through collaborative care. They provide housing through four programs: the Men's Shelter, Room at the Inn (Women's Shelter), SafePlace (micro shelters) and Third Street Commons (non-congregate shelter)

QUARTER FOUR:

Co-op Recycling Center

The Co-op Recycling Center provides multiple resources for most of your recycling needs in Corvallis and the rest of the valley. They are the only place in town where you can recycle Styrofoam and are a focal point in South Town that helps fulfill our community's needs for recycling items that would otherwise go to the landfill.

Corvallis Sister Cities Association - Gondar

Corvallis Sister Cities Association - Gondar's mission is to collaborate with the people of Gondar, Ethiopia (one of Corvallis' two sister cities), in developing sustainable solutions and promoting cultural awareness, respect, and understanding. Working with people to access clean water and improve quality of education is at the heart of this work

Grace Center for Adult Day Services

Grace Center's mission is to provide day services that optimize the cognitive and physical abilities of seniors and adults with disabilities so they can remain in their homes, as independent as possible. Serving the community since 1983, Grace Center provides therapeutic programs and services designed around key areas including socialization, exercise, memory care, health monitoring, post-rehabilitation, nutrition, hygiene, and respite for caregivers. Programs are aimed to improve the quality of life for both caregivers and participants.

Greenbelt Land Trust

Greenbelt Land Trust works to conserve in perpetuity native habitats, working lands, and lands of natural beauty, which provide a connection to nature for residents of the mid-Willamette Valley. Greenbelt Land Trust works alongside landowners and conservation partners across the Willamette Valley to create innovative conservation strategies to protect wildlife habitat, water quality, and recreational resources.
